

FACE MASK PROTOCOL ON CAMPUS

EFFECTIVE September 15, 2021

Where and when do I have to wear a face mask?

Note:

- Wearing face masks is mandatory in all classrooms even if instruction is being delivered at a minimum 2 metre distance from the nearest student.
- Faculty who are conducting on-site video demonstrations (live or pre-recorded) may want to remove their masks for the recording of the video. This would be permissible for the duration of the shoot provided that they are the only individual in the studio.
- Art Models who are visiting a studio or class must wear a mask at all times.
- For course related photoshoots and filming, temporarily removing the subjects mask is permitted with the following restrictions:
 - No more than one (1) videographer/photographer and one (1) subject in the space
 - Only the subject may remove their mask while being photographed/filmed
 - The subject may remove their mask for no more than 15 minutes
 - Physical distancing must be maintained while the subject's mask is removed
- Masks may be removed temporarily while eating and drinking with the following requirements:
 - All food and beverages must be consumed in single offices (if applicable), the main mall, the cafeteria, or outside
 - There are no requirements to physically distance or sit only with members of your household or your 2 close contacts, and there are no limit on the number of people per table
- The AUArts Mask Protocol is based off guidelines and requirements set out by Alberta Health. More information can be found here.



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Why are face masks mandatory?

There are many areas in our building where it is hard to maintain physical distancing (e.g. hallways under 2m in width, stairways, and elevators). Wearing masks is an effective tool to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 and help keep our community safer from infection; especially when coupled with regular hand washing/hygiene, physical distancing, and staying home when sick.

Exception for a medical condition

In the specific settings where a mask is required, anyone unable to wear a mask due to a medical condition will require a medical exception letter from an authorized health professional. Employees should contact Human Resources and students should contact learning.assistance@auarts.ca

What kind of face mask do I have to wear?

Non-medical face masks or medical face masks are acceptable. Canada Health guidelines for non-medical masks can be found here. Masks should fit well and be of high quality. People at risk of severe outcomes should wear medical masks when in settings with people outside of their household. Gaiters, bandanas, and neck warmers are NOT permitted to be used as a substitute for a mask.

What happens if I don't comply?

Community members will be required to wear a mask in order to enter the building. Containing the spread of the virus and the safety of our community is everyone's responsibility. Anyone can and should report non-compliance to Campus Security. Anyone not wearing a mask when in common areas of the building will be asked to put one on. Consequences for non-compliance are as follows:

Will the university supply face masks?

The university will supply disposable non-medical face masks to anyone who does not bring their own (available at Security).
